Early-career scholars interested in aging, health, & incarceration often lack mentorship, community, collaboration, & funding, & many are the sole investigators in this area at their institutions. Established in 2019, the NIA-funded ARCH Network connects a multidisciplinary, international group of researchers & community leaders committed to understanding the life course experiences of justice-involved older adults & translating findings into policy & practice. Over the past five years, ARCH has supported early-career scholars through mentorship, collaboration, & assistance in developing funded research programs.
